Can Kerry get back to winning ways after last weekend's malfunction?

KERRY face Meath this afternoon at the Austin Stack Park on a recovery mission after being on the receiving end of a right trimming by a fired up Offaly side at O'Connor Park Tullamore on Sunday last.

For those of us who were present it was not pretty viewing and neither the players nor manager Fintan O'Connor would consider it an acceptable performance.

But while trolling, banter, and insults are all part of a players and managers experience after losing, particularly in the modern era of social media, some of what went on was way over the top and one presumes the squad and management were ready to handle it the proper way by ignoring it.

It's okay if you are sad or disappointed over a loss. But remember to keep control. Don't allow your emotions to get the better of you. A tough loss like last Sunday shouldn't drive you from supporting your team. Staying loyal after a loss can give the players a tremendous psychological boost as they try to regroup.

While last Sunday's performance was

unacceptable let's put it into perspective. Kerry had condemned Offaly to Christy Ring hurling two years ago and also beat them in the league, so last Sunday was the equivalent to an All-Ireland Final for Offaly.

Kerry wanted to win but not as badly as Offaly did because for Kerry one would imagine, everything is about the Joe McDonagh Cup this year and the league is not the number one priority. Does Kerry want to beat Meath,

Wicklow and Carlow? Absolutely they do but they also want to get their best fifteen fit and firing by the time they face Down in the opening round of the Joe McDonagh Cup next month.

Right now and last Sunday, this Kerry team faced many more adversities than usual,

but still refused to offer any excuses other than they did not perform. Just take a look at the long injury list that Fintan O'Connor and his management team are facing. They are without Martin Stackpoole, Bryan Murphy, Tomás O'Connor, Michael O'Leary, Brendan O'Leary, Brandon Barrett, Jordan Conway, Shane Conway, Cian Hussey, John Mark Foley and possibly John Buckley after last Sunday.



That is a crippling injury list by any parameter and the only light at the end of end of the tunnel is possibly the lights of an oncoming train with Shane Conway at the helm.

So while a no show is never acceptable,

So while a no show is never acceptable, Kerry are nowhere close to being at full strength right now and I think that at least six of the walking wounded would

be first choice on any Kerry team sheet.

But it is what it is and Kerry can only play with the cards that they have and today they face a Meath side that will



see this as an ideal opportunity to take down a Kerry side that will naturally be smarting after last Sunday's drubbing. But sometimes it's dangerous to poke the bear when he is hurting and Meath could feel the backlash as Kerry put in a performance that would in part erase the memory of O'Connor Park.

Meath lost to Offaly but beat Wicklow last weekend 0-20 to 0-11 with Jack Regan top scoring on the forty with 0-6, Gavin McGowan contributed 0-3, Pádraic O'Hanrahan scored 0-3 while Mark O'Sullivan and Alan Douglas added 0-2 each. They had eight different scorers and their overall accuracy stats were 20/32 or 62% and from play 12/20 (60%) which is impressive.

Charlie Ennis is a fine keeper and Ben McGowan, James Toher and Keith Keoghan are excellent defenders. Pádraic O'Hanrahan likes to attack from midfield while Jack Regan has always troubled Kerry defences.

It is difficult to know what team Kerry will have on duty but it is likely there will be three or four changes from Sunday last. As for injuries and the prospect of Shane Conway returning,

O'Connor explains he is hopeful in Shane's case.

"We are having bad luck with injuries and John Buckley's injury is hamstring. I hope

Shane Conway will be available next weekend. We were hoping to have him today and picked him to play but he had a sickness during the week and he wasn't right and not feeling great so it would not have been fair on him throw him in the fray having done nothing up to now. Apart from Shane the rest will not be available."

So Kerry are on a redemption mission today and it will be difficult to get back up after last Sunday but if any group of lads can, this Kerry side has that capacity. To borrow a quote from the great man Michael Jordan, "I can accept failure, everyone fails at something. But I can't accept not trying." Kerry will be trying hard today.
