## Dr. Crokes will need all their experience against in-form Templenoe

Templenoe v Dr. Crokes, Fitzgerald Stadium, Sunday November 7th, 12.45pm

DR. Crokes have been among the top guns almost as long as the Kerry County Championship itself. Templenoe, on the other hand, are almost the ultimate in rags-to-riches. They were contesting the County Novice

Championship as recently as 2013. Let's face it, in many ways this is basically the movie that Walt Disney would have loved to make.

Neither can exactly be said to have shown their hand in comfortable victories in the opening round over West Kerry and Shannon Rangers.

Not only do Dr. Crokes have the pedigree; they have the recent history

on their side as well. They have been kingpins of the Kingdom in recent years until the advent of East Kerry. They have won six of the last ten titles on offer, including three in a row from '16, '17, and '18. That includes two Munster club titles and an All Ireland title in 2017. They have reached at least a quarter-final every year since 2014.

Templenoe cannot exactly say the same. They have reached two quarter-finals ever - last year

(they were beaten, ironically enough, by none other than Dr. Crokes), and this year. Templenoe, in fact, have only ever played in these two Kerry Senior County Championships, and frankly, it is an incredible achievement for a club the size of Templenoe to do so.

That record is very deceptive, though. Templenoe are the form team coming into this one. Dr. Crokes, in fact, have been finding the going tough so far this year. They survived comfortably in Division One and came creditably close to a League Final. The Senior Club Championship was a bit of a disaster for them, however. They beat neighbours Spa

well in the opening round but their second match was less than five minutes old when Templenoe slammed in goal number two and Crokes never seemed to recover. Or rather, Templenoe seemed to have that bit more hunger on the day and won pulling up.

A further defeat to Kenmare put Dr. Crokes into a possible relegation playoff against Killarney Legion if they don't reach the County Final.

A little bit of added seasoning for the broth!

Crokes still have some of the solid core of their all-conquering side in John Payne, Mike Moloney, Johnny Buckley, evergreen Brian Looney, Fionn Fitzgerald, and Kieran O'Leary. The likes of Shane Murphy, Gavin White, Micheál Burns, David Shaw (slowly coming back into form after carrying a long-term injury) and main score-getter Tony Brosnan are quality players who wear or have worn county jerseys. David Naughton and Mark O'Shea are established players. But Mark Cooper, Tom Doyle, Evan Looney, Cian McMahon, and Harry Potts are new to senior football and it's a huge leap.

Dr. Crokes are missing no less than 6 of the team that started against Templenoe just last year in the corresponding fixture, partly through transition and partly through injury.

Templenoe's team selection is remarkably consistent - a small club side hasn't much choice in such matters, but it seems to work out for them. Obviously, the four county players are the big guns, Tadhq Morley, Gavin Crowley,

Adrian Spillane in midfield, and Killian Spillane.
The juxtaposition of Tony Brosnan and Killian Spillane on either side, probably the two best out-and-out snipers in the Championship, is one of the fascinating subplots.
The match-ups should tell a lot. Templenoe, with Josh Crowley Holland backing up Adrian Spillane, will hope to take midfield. Gavin

Gavin Crowley will most likely pick up Micheál Burns, while Tadhg Morley must be a virtual certainty to try and curb Tony Brosnan. At the other end, Fionn Fitzgerald will most likely mark Stephen O'Sullivan, while John Payne and Killian Spillane

All in all, I'd be inclined to give Crokes a tentative nod - they tend to grow stronger as championships progress - but it is a very tentative nod indeed!

## Stacks have momentum but face a tough task against South Kerry

Austin Stacks v South Kerry, Fitzgerald Stadium, Sunday November 7th, 2.45pm

AUSTIN Stacks, not for the first time in their illustrious history, sent a seismic shock through the 2021 Kerry County Championship by knocking out reigning champions East Kerry. Believe me, that sent ripples through all the remaining contenders!

Of course, that wouldn't matter under the usual format of back doors in the championship. I'll be honest; I'm loving the straight knockout nature of championship football at the moment. Every game is a welter of excitement and I'm buzzing from one game to another.

Austin Stacks, by virtue of that 1-7 to 1-5 win, will

be going in as favourites. Dylan Casey locked down no less a player than David Clifford, having been equally impressive against Seán O'Shea previously - granted, Conor Jordan's superbly understated ability to regulate the supply channel has been under-estimated.

Jack O'Shea darted up for good scores, but I was more impressed by his tight marking; this guy has as much intelligence as skill. The experience of Paul O'Sullivan and Ronan Shanahan proved vital as well.

Midfielder Joe O'Connor looks a certainty for a Kerry jersey very soon. However, I think Greg Horan isn't far behind him, one of the most under-estimated midfielders in Kerry. Kieran Donaghy is a Kerry legend, but I was most impressed against East Kerry with his movement. He was a ringmaster to performing lions - except these lions were going for the jugular every time. Fiachna Mangan, Michael O'Donnell, predatory Shane O'Callaghan, and dual star Michael O'Gara. Add in Seán Quilter and Darragh O'Brien off the bench - well, the South Kerry defence would want to have at

least one bowl of Weetabix on Sunday morning! The 2014 champions are coming with serious intent.

The 2015 champions are not going to care. They actually have a better record than Stacks in recent years, with two quarter-finals, a semi-final, and a final in the past five years. Last year, of course, both teams departed in the first round. Whereas

Stacks sent up a cloud of dust as East Kerry crashed, I'm afraid Feale Rangers' demise was never going to make that impact.

The full back line of Brian Sugrue, Fionán Clifford, and Shane O'Connor were a bulwark. The half

back line of Graham O'Sullivan, Mark Griffin, and Ronan O'Shea are an attacking platform at least as much as a rampart. Jack Daly in midfield has been really catching the eye this year (Man of the Match in the South Kerry Final), while Rob Wharton is likely to give Joe O'Connor a real test. I have to say that it is strange, and a little bit poignant, not to see Bryan Sheehan's name on the programme.

Éanna O'Connor isn't any prodigal son, but South Kerry would be well advised to prepare the fatted calf anyway. He adds a major threat on his return from Kildare. Flanking him are the St. Marys' players Conor O'Shea and Aidan Walsh; no introduction required.

Darragh O'Sullivan is relatively new up front, but he did well after starting for Diarmuid Keating. Moreover, his threat frees up space for lively Dylan O'Donoghue and Niall Ó Sé - there are few more worrying sights in Kerry football than Niall Ó Sé in space.

There have been real signs of growth in South Kerry football in recent years - Coláiste na Sceilge reaching the Colleges O'Sullivan Cup Final and competing in the Corn Uí Mhuirí is a real boost for the area. The extra week and the game under their belt will suit the divisional side, one of only two left standing.

Austin Stacks will be going in as favourites here, but I wouldn't be counting any chickens. After all, South Kerry winning this one would still not be the biggest surprise so far of this year's championship!
